Around the Word Devotions + the week of May 28-June 3, 2023

THEME OF THE WEEK: The Holy Spirit: Creator of the Church

The risen Lord Jesus has ascended on high and sits at the right hand of the Father. Although His work of salvation is complete, He continues to serve as our Great High Priest before His Father and keeps His promise to abide with His Church so that we are not left as orphans. The festival of Pentecost was just the beginning of the Holy Spirit's sending and working for us as our Lord promised. The Holy Spirit comes to us and is at work for us through the reading and preaching of God's Word, Holy Baptism, the Lord's Supper and Holy Absolution.

In this way, Our Lord continues to daily and richly forgive sins, sanctify and keep His Church.

SCRIPTURE: John 14:23-31 The Work of the Holy Spirit

Our Lord's words and teaching in this text overflow with promise and comfort. It would be impossible to know and love Jesus, or live in Him without the Holy Spirit. Jesus wants His disciples to be certain of His Father's love for them. He sent the Holy Spirit so that He and His Son might abide in you. The Spirit teaches you Christ's Word and strengthens you in faith. He protects and defends you from the assaults of the devil, the world, and your own sinful flesh. The Father does all this for you, His beloved child, because of His Son and through His Spirit that you might have life eternal and a peace the world can never ever

give. Thank You, O Lord, for sending the Holy Spirit to call, gather, enlighten, and sanctify me and Your whole church. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 48 Jesus is God's Temple and our Strong Fortress

Psalm 48 is a hymn of praise and thanksgiving for Yahweh's presence in Zion's temple which made Jerusalem "the city of our God" (v. 8). Even though Yahweh would let the temple be destroyed and Jerusalem led into exile for her sin, Yahweh remained a saving fortress for all who would repent and take refuge in Him. Our God does not simply dwell in temples made by human hands. His presence on earth is not in a building, but in a person: Jesus Christ. He built His Church on the confession of Saint Peter, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God" and promised that "the gates of hell shall not prevail against it" (Matt.

16:16, 18). Lord Jesus, You are our strong fortress forever and in You nothing can prevail against us. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: 1 Peter 4:7-11 e Living in Christ and Loving our Neighbor

Our Lord Jesus did not say, "apart from me you can do some things." No! He said, "apart from me you can do nothing" (Jn. 15:5). He also promised to send the "Helper, the Holy Spirit" to teach us and guide us in all truth, to be with us as we abide in Him and He in us (Jn. 14:16, 26). United to Christ Jesus in Holy Baptism, He guides us in His love and truth and works through the various gifts He gives each of us to love and serve our neighbor. Because no one can do this by their own strength, Christ Jesus supplies us His strength through His Word and Sacraments "that in everything God may be glorified" (v. 11). Lord Jesus, as I remember my baptism daily, help me to die and rise with You that You may be glorified in all that I say and do. Amen.



SCRIPTURE: Joel 2:28-32 Joel's Prophecy Fulfilled at Pentecost

Moses prayed for it, Joel prophesied it, Jesus promised it and God fulfilled the pouring out of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. The Spirit of God had always dwelt with and in God's people. No saving faith was ever possible without the Holy Spirit. David prays for Yahweh not to take His Holy Spirit from him (Ps. 51:11). But now at Pentecost, as Joel prophesied, the Spirit of God comes to dwell in a fuller and more permanent way with all of God's people (Acts 2:17-22, 33). Not all are apostles, prophets, or teachers (1 Cor. 12:27-31), but all are one in Christ Jesus and have been given the full measure of the Spirit. In this way, all of God's people are prophets with a small p, proclaiming the good news of Christ. Thank You, Lord for giving us Your Holy Spirit. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: John 14:15-21 Jesus Lives in and Loves through You

"If you love me, you would take out the trash" is something we might expect to hear from a parent or spouse, but not Jesus. And yet, Jesus says, "If you love me, you will keep my commandments" (v.15). Contrary to how this sounds, Jesus is not putting us back under the law or making His love conditional. Knowing Jesus, loving Jesus and keeping His commands go together in a natural, holistic, organic way, even as a fruit tree produces fruit and a cow produces milk. Connected to Jesus in Holy Baptism, He abides in us and we in Him. As branches connected to the Vine, His love flows into us and through us so that we love Him and keep His commands (Jn. 15:5). Thank You, Lord for loving me complete-ly and unconditionally that I may love You, Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Ephesians 4:7-16 Christ Gives His Gifts

The crucified and risen Jesus led God's people out of slavery by winning victory over the devil and the grave, thus destroying man's captivity to sin and death. Ascended on high, Christ gifts His Church with the fivefold office of the ministry. Through this office Christ remains present and active throughout as He is the head that holds all things together (vv. 15-16). For the benefit of His Church, Christ gives this office "to equip the saints," "for the work of ministry," and "for the building up of the body of Christ" (v.12). Lord, continue to build up Your Church through the gifts You give. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 145 Redeemed in Christ to Live under Him in His Kingdom

Most of us recognize Psalm 145:15-16 as the opening words of the meal prayer, "Asking a Blessing," in *Luther's Small Catechism*. These words are appropriate as we give thanks to God for His gracious and abundant providential care for us and all creation. And yet, this hymn of praise extends far beyond God's first article gifts as it anticipates the "mighty acts" and "awesome deeds" of Christ Jesus. It is He who is righteous in all His ways, kind in all His works, near to all who call on Him, and saves us by His "mighty deeds" (vv. 11, 17-19). He has redeemed us and brought us into His "everlasting kingdom" to live under His "dominion" that "endures throughout all generations" (v.13). *Thank You, O Lord for Your steadfast love in Christ. Amen.*
